

Two Generations, One Family: Dennis & Christopher Ziadie

t's sad and heartbreaking when a son joins his father in death, especially when both had so much in common. In the case of **Dennis** and **Christopher Ziadie**, their passion for football brought them together, representing Jamaica and **St. George's College** with pride. Both of them were highly skilled players, earning the admiration and respect of their peers. But they were not just outstanding athletes. **Dennis** and **Christopher** were also kind-hearted and generous individuals who inspired others with their positive attitudes. They were loved for their personalities and their ability to motivate those around them.

Christopher was a man of principle who always spoke his mind and stood up for what he believed in. As a former captain of the Columbia Men's Team, he was a fierce competitor and a skilled player who made his mark in the lvy League and on the Jamaican national team. Dennis, on the other hand, was an excellent left-winger who was passionate about football and spoke about the game incessantly with his friends. He was approachable, religious, and known for his meticulous appearance. He was not only a great father to his children but also a mentor and father figure to his players.





Dennis and Christopher's bond extended beyond the football field. Christopher was coached by his father during his childhood, but Dennis passed away too soon due to a tragic bus crash during the 1986 World Cup Finals in Mexico. Even in death, Dennis remained an inspiration to Christopher, who carried on his legacy both as a player and as a teacher. When you hear Dennis' former players speak about him, you can feel the profound respect they had for him. He was a coach who not only taught his players the game but also instilled in them a sense of discipline, integrity, and teamwork. In his memory, the JC Old Boys Association started the TrueBlue reunion, a testament to the impact he had on the lives of those around him. Together, Dennis and Christopher left a legacy

of love, kindness, and dedication to family and community. They may no longer be with us, but their memory lives on through the people whose lives they touched and the lessons they imparted. **Dennis** and **Christopher** are shining examples of what it means to live a life of purpose and meaning, and their story is one that will inspire generations to come.



Davy was a standout player during his high school career, setting numerous records that stood for many years. He led his Wolmer's Boys High School team to a triple crown in Jamaican high school football championships. Davy established the single-season record of 23 goals, which stood for 27 years, and also set the career record of 48 goals. Before transferring to Wolmer's, Richard had won a Manning Cup Championship with Jamaica College High School (JC) in 1968.

In 1971, while still in high school, **Davy** was selected to play for the Jamaica National football team and scored on his debut against Haiti.

He went on to represent the Jamaica National football team on 27 occasions, scoring 11 goals.

Davy went on to play soccer for Howard University Bisons, where he helped the team win the 1974 Division 1 National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Championship. He was an instrumental player for the team and was the architect of the winning goal in the NCAA Championship game. Howard University Bisons posted a perfect 19-0-0 season record, which remains unbeaten and unmatched by any other Collegiate soccer team after over 35 years.

After his college career, **Davy** was drafted by the Connecticut Yankees of the American Soccer League (ASL). He played for several teams in various leagues, including the Washington D.C.-based Jamaica "Nats," where he led the league in scoring most of those years. He retired from soccer in 1987.

Davy was a talented and skilled player who left an indelible mark in the history of Jamaican and American soccer. His records and achievements still inspire and motivate young soccer players to this day.



JAMAICA COLLEGE Principal's Message

The Jamaica College Old Boys' Association of Florida - True Blue Weekend

extend warm greetings to College Men of the Florida Chapter. We are very pleased that you have continued the True Blue Weekend which has become a calendar tradition, with Old Boys from all over converging on Florida to link up. Congratulations Gentlemen!

The Jamaica College Old Boys of Florida have continued their unwavering, unbroken support for the College, serving with gladness. The current students and staff have been the beneficiaries of several contributions in various areas of school life. Our co-curricular activities, sports teams and coaches thrive as a result of your work behind the scenes. WE ARE GRATEFUL.



Our school population is just over 1700 boys, with a teaching staff complement of about 120 and about 65 support staff. We have increased marginally in size as we allowed some boys to repeat grades after the learning loss due to Covid 19. In fact Covid's impact on the academic development of our students will take some years to remediate. For example, we have noted a decline in CSEC Mathematics from over 90% passes to 70% in the 2022 exams. This is cause for concern and we have added contact hours and extra support to Mathematics and English, especially in grades 7-9.

Overall, our performance in external exams plateaued with 15 of 24 subjects having pass rates of over 85%. A significant amount of boys achieved national and regional placements. Work is burning...

We are back Face to Face with our efforts now on repairing losses in learning of the last two and a half years while also preparing for external examinations. We have also lost over 20 teachers since the beginning of the year, mostly to the overseas market, and this has meant recruiting and training of new staff. Even with the new salary increases, we anticipate a further exodus at the end of the school year. These factors, in addition to managing a series of deaths and a challenging financial position, have made this year a most difficult one. We will get past this with reviewed, renewed focus and strategic planning. Our emphasis remains on STEAM and the process of change in the teaching methodology is ongoing. New teachers are embracing the 'hands-on' methods and the boys are more engaged. A work in progress.

There are infrastructure and equipment needs including an Infirmary/Health Center, Information Center/Digital Library and a Music Facility. We also need improved classrooms, emergency water supply and termite treatment for the campus. Staff incentives also need support. These in addition to the urgent needs of our sporting teams, especially the Track Team.



JAMAICA COLLEGE Principal's Message Cont'd

Our boys continue to perform inside and outside of the classroom. We were the top two teams (1st and 2nd) at the recent National Robotics Competition. We received the Inspire Award (the top prize) and were also the winning Alliance with Immaculate Conception High. Both teams will soon be off to the World Championships in Houston. BIG **ACHIEVEMENT!**

We are still competing at the High School Stock Exchange Competition where we have won for the last 5 years.

Our U19 volleyball team lost 2-3 in the urban finals and our U16 table tennis team also lost 2-3 in the final. Both teams have had a very good season as we have a high quality programme in place.

Our U19 basketballers reached the semis. The swimming and cricket teams are improving. We are fixing the School Challenge programme.

In football, last term we returned the Manning Cup and Super Cup to our shelves. We were semi-finalists in the U16 and All Island Champions in the U14 competition. There is a Trophy Tour coming your way!

The Track and Field team won 6 races at the Gibson Relays and is now preparing for Champs. The hardest part of our year has been the death of two excellent male teachers (Jeovannie Baxter and Diego Hines) and two students (David Virgo and Daniel Frith), with another (Kemeish Barr) in serious condition at the hospital. These deaths gutted our school with inexplicable grief.

We bawl, we pray and we press on...We are in constant dialogue with President Xavier and his team and we salute our Florida Old Boys who have consistently given "forward" to the College and the development of our current boys. WE APPRECIATE YOU.



Dear STGC and JC Old Boys, and Friends,

reetings on behalf of the St. George's College family. I would like to commend the organizers of this year's True Blue/Dennis Zadie weekend for continuing such an excellent tradition of collaboration and sportsmanship!

In my 16 years of serving as Principal of St. George's College, these past few years have been the most challenging, as I am sure that it has also been for my dear friend Wayne Robinson, Principal of Jamaica College. As we continue on the road of post-Covid recovery, events like these are a source of joy for our school communities.



At St. George's College, we have risen to the recov-

ery challenge though targeted professional development for teachers and extensive and carefully planned academic and social support programmes for students. This year we have hosted three of six planned weekend residential boot camps for fifth form students at no cost to them, as well as weekend classes and development programmes for our younger students. Despite the challenges of 2021-2022, twenty of the twenty six subjects undertaken at CSEC and thirty eight of the thirty nine at the CAPE level, had passes of 80% or more.

Our Sports teams have been performing well. We are particularly proud of our under 16 Basket ball team which won the ISAA Southern Conference Championship as well as the ISSA and All-island competition. Our Lacrosse Team is currently in the semi-finals and the only team that has been undefeated in the competition thus far. In order to help students reconnect and re-engage, we have more than doubled the numbers involved in sports and clubs and societies this year.

Our donors and supporters continue to be very generous. In September 2022, we blessed and commissioned two new buses. In January 2023 we implemented WiFi across the campus, created AV rooms on every classroom block, and installed projectors in several classrooms, in support of our theme for the academic year promoting 21st century skills, "4C a Great Future; Create, Collaborate, Communicate, , Think Critically."

Thank you all for supporting your Alma Maters as together we shape the future.
